PERMIT INSTRUCTIONS

Foothills Fire Protection District requires permits to facilitate the inventory of the types and quantities of hazardous materials, processes, and equipment present in the district; and to insure through inspections, that the applicants for such permits would not present an unacceptable hazard to the fire district.

All applications for a required permit must be made to the Foothills Fire Protection District, which can require plans to accompany applications for such items as propane tanks, underground fuel tanks, and places of assembly and any construction within the district. Businesses not having required permits at the time of an inspection should apply to Foothills Fire Protection District for a permit. After a permit application has been made to the Foothills Fire Protection District, an inspection of the premises will determine whether the application is approved or rejected.

Permits constitute permission to maintain, store, use or handle materials, or to conduct processes which produce conditions hazardous to life or property, or to install equipment used in connection with such activities. This permission shall not be construed as authority to violate any provisions of the International Fire Code. Permits are issued with the understanding that the applicant will carry out the activity in compliance with the International Fire Code and any approved plans accompanying the application. Permits may be revoked for cause as described in the International Fire Code.

Permits issued by the Fire Prevention Bureau are valid for a period of one year. Businesses requiring more than one permit can have individual permits consolidated into a single permit.

Permits are required for, but not limited to, the following activities:

- Fire Suppression or Protection Plans
- Commercial Construction and Additions within the District
- Tents
- Special Events
- Places of Assembly
- Private Water Storage Tanks (Cisterns)/Underground Fuel Tanks, and Propane Tanks
- Compressed Gases
- Flammable/Combustible Liquid Storage or Dispensing
- Hazardous Chemicals
- High Hazard Residential Occupancies
- Open Burning (Requires a permit from Jefferson Co., Dept. of Health, available on our Web Site)
- Fireworks and Fireworks Display (Requires a permit from the JeffCo & FFPD)
- Blasting (Contact Jefferson County Sheriff before & when complete)
